If you can answer this question in an essay of between 500 and 1,500 words and meet the eligibility criteria below, then you can apply for this college scholarship.

Eligibility Requirements and Criteria

The recipient of the award will receive \$1,000 for his/her first year of undergraduate study to help pay tuition and book expenses. The scholarship award will be renewed each year, with a maximum grant of \$4,000, if the student maintains good academic standing and demonstrates involvement in campus activities. If, for any reason, the recipient leaves school, the remainder of the award will be forfeited.

The prerequisites necessary to apply for the award are as follows:

1. The applicant must be a resident of Allegheny County.
2. The applicant must be a high school senior who has been accepted at a college or university.
3. The applicant's cumulative Grade Point Average at the end of the first semester senior year must be 3.25 or greater (although exceptions may apply).
4. The award is based on a student's academic achievement, community service/work experience, financial need, and interest in the history, architecture, and/or landscape design of Allegheny County.
5. The applicant must write an essay, provide a high school transcript, a copy of his/her college acceptance letter, and at least one letter of recommendation.
6. The applicant cannot be related to Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation Board members nor to board members of any of its affiliates or to any employees of any of those entities.
