Dear Members and Friends:

Last year was a comeback year for our Historic Religious Properties (HRP) program, thanks to the successful challenge grant campaign initiated by two of our members and the outpouring of support we received from 420 members and friends. Because of that support, we were able to award 14 grants this March totaling \$78,600 and five technical assistance grants. (2011 HRP recipients are listed on the reverse side of this letter; roofs, exterior woodwork, façades, doors, stairs, and windows will be restored or repaired this year, thanks to our matching grants.)

To keep the momentum of giving going, we are holding our annual appeal now and are asking you to give generously again. Our goal in the next few months is to raise at least \$50,000 so we can offer another round of grant applications and begin building a \$2.5 million endowment to generate \$100,000 in annual interest to underwrite our HRP program. Through bequests and other forms of planned gifts, HRP supporters can help us build an endowment to ensure that funds will always be available for critical preservation efforts.



PHLF is the only organization most historic religious properties in Allegheny County can turn to for façade-related help, and the congregations are deeply grateful for our matching grants and technical assistance. By encouraging careful, informed stewardship, we help ensure that these architecturally significant places of worship will be taken care of for future generations. Historic religious properties

are **long-term assets**—centers of art, culture, and community, as well as valuable places for contemplation and many social services. Imagine your community without the historic religious properties in use and in good repair.

One of our members recently wrote: "I have received your printed newsletter and an e-mail one today—PHLF is doing so much to improve our area. Congratulations!"

This long-time member was referring to the work PHLF is doing to revitalize the Fifth and Forbes area in downtown Pittsburgh, the Hamnett Place neighborhood in Wilkinsburg, and the main street business districts of 14 communities in Allegheny, Armstrong, and Westmoreland counties. She was referring to our easement program that protects historic properties in perpetuity, our preservation loan fund that recently supported the restoration of seven historic houses in Manchester, and our educational programs that help more than 10,000 people appreciate the Pittsburgh region each year and result in guidebooks such as August Wilson: Pittsburgh Places in His Life and Plays.

And, she was referring to our Historic Religious Properties (HRP) program that depends on donations from PHLF members and friends. Since the program's inception in 1997, PHLF has awarded 225 grants totaling \$790,000; those funds have leveraged \$2.9 million in restoration projects!
