












Shown above are a variety of houses that we have bought in the Mexican War Streets area in recent weeks under our new grant from the Richard King Mellon Foundation in the amount of \$250,000 as described in the last newsletter. Work will proceed soon on cleaning the exterior of all these buildings and we will soon begin interior renovation as well. Also shown is restoration work moving ahead at our small frame buildings at Eloise and Day Way. The houses had not been painted in over 30 years according to neighbors and the basement wall joist was completely rotted. Our carpenters rebuilt the entire foundation beams and now we are patching woodwork in preparation for painting.



based on the revitalization of the buildings there. The group has been willing to fund initial design studies for a portion of the business area so that we can determine what kinds of adaptive uses can be made of the old buildings that date from around the turn of the century along Warrington Avenue. Work is now underway and we will be reporting to our members on our progress in the near future.
