

Looking Ahead: Priorities in 1997

The New Year is well under way, and Landmarks' staff is implementing a work plan approved on November 22, 1996 by its Board of Trustees. Our program priorities are as follows.

Neighborhood Revitalization

Howard B. Slaughter, Jr., director of preservation services, will:

- extend short-term loans to Allegheny County neighborhood organizations for the restoration of historic properties through Landmarks' Preservation Loan Fund; monitor existing loans; and provide technical assistance as needed;
- assist Manchester in its \$20 million development campaign to demolish 107 public housing units which will be replaced by 142 new or substantially renovated units of housing;
- provide assistance to the Pittsburgh Community Reinvestment Group;
- develop a pilot program for the restoration of porches on Liverpool Street in Manchester;
- work with Mellon Bank to fund "Comprehensive Neighborhood Development Initiative" loans and provide technical assistance;
- evaluate proposals submitted to Landmarks under the "Working In Neighborhoods" initiative and recommend projects for funding assistance through an eleven-bank consortium;
- work closely with financial institutions to offer Community Reinvestment Act training and to ensure that affordable home-ownership programs are available to low- and moderate-income people;
- oversee the Historic Religious Properties initiative;
- work with selected historic city neighborhoods to secure historic designation status through the City of Pittsburgh. In regard to this effort, we are pleased to report that in February more than 200 properties in the East Allegheny area known as Deutschtown were declared part of a City Historic District. The request was submitted to City Council by the East Allegheny Community Council; Landmarks offered assistance throughout the designation process.

Preservation Projects and Advocacy

Thanks in part to a loan of \$25,000 from Landmarks' Preservation Loan Fund this February, PHASE (Perry Hilltop for Successful Enterprise) will be repairing the roof and renovating the John Brashear house at 1954 Perrysville Avenue. The three-story wooden house was damaged by fire in 1993 and has been vacant ever since. When renovated, the building will house apartments, the PHASE office, and a community space.

assistant for public policy and CIO, will concentrate their energies on the following program priorities. They will:

- conduct field research and meet with various individuals and organizations to survey major preservation needs throughout Allegheny County;
- research a facade easement program and develop recommendations regarding a possible expansion of our existing program;



- work with the Committee on the Allegheny County Courthouse Restoration and develop a plan to restore the public areas on the ground floor of the Courthouse;
- work with The Pittsburgh Cultural Trust, the Mayor's office, and the Urban Redevelopment Authority to evaluate the restoration of historic downtown buildings for residential, hotel, and office purposes;

 $m{F}_{or}'$ a whole generation of preservationists, the fight against urban renewal was the crucible in which their theories and convictions were tested and refined. It was probably the major catalytic event in the growth of the preservation movement. In reflecting on the legacy of that time, it's worth recalling an extraordinary statement by John Kenneth $Galbraith: `The\ preservation\ move$ ment has one great curiosity. There is never retrospective controversy or regret. Preservationists are the only people in the world who are invariably confirmed in their wisdom after the fact.'

"Preservationists were right about urban renewal. And in the process of speaking out against it, they ultimately helped change government policy, helped change longstanding patterns of behavior, helped change the way Americans thought about our cities.

"Now we face our own challenge in the fight against sprawl, which is to us what urban renewal was to an earlier generation. We are joined by thousands of people who never thought the label 'preservationist' applied to them—people who merely want communities that work, that are safe, attractive and livable. Working together, we can do what our predecessors did. We can make a difference. We can change the face of America for the better."

Mellon Bank Contributes to Preservation Loan Fund

The Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation is pleased to acknowledge a grant in the amount of \$10,000 from the Mellon Bank Corporate Contributions Committee. In Memoriam: Joan Fulton (1932–1996)

Our good friend and supporter of three decades, Joan Fulton, died on November 8, 1996 after a valiant fight against cancer. Mrs. Fulton was one of six founding members of Landmarks in 1964. During Landmarks' first decade she served on its Executive Committee and Board of Trustees.

The daughter of Rita and Edward Lucien, Mrs. Fulton received a Bachelor of Arts in architecture from Carnegie Mellon University and attended graduate school at Yale University. An architect, city planner, and certified fine arts appraiser and arts advisor, Mrs. Fulton provided a fund of knowledge to our organization about architecture, antiques, and the fine arts.

In the early days of Landmarks, together with founding members Charles C. Arensberg, Barbara D. Hoffstot, William Oliver, James D. Van Trump, and Arthur P. Ziegler, Jr., Joan Fulton helped define the organization's role and establish goals. During lengthy evening meetings she contributed to the discussions about the

role historic preservation should play in our city and county. She was active with Landmarks' first survey of historic buildings in Allegheny County and with the Historic Landmark plaque program.

Joan Fulton was a remarkable woman and leader in the arts in Pittsburgh. We extend our deepest sympathy to her husband, Dr. Robert E. Fulton, and children, Peter and Christine.




